

GREENING ARUNDEL ASK QUESTIONS AND CALLS FOR ACTION

Arundel's own 'Question Time' brought in the crowds as politicians, scientists, residents and business people debated the hot topic of climate change on Friday.

MP and shadow cabinet member, Nick Herbert, Councillors Nigel Peters and Keith Taylor and scientist Dr Jaqui Dyer formed the panel at the splendid town hall, answering questions from the audience. While they were unanimous that the human cause of climate change is a serious and urgent issue, they views differed on how that might be tackled. Chaired by Arundel Agenda 21's Kay Wagland, controversy raged over wind turbines on the downs and nuclear power, but all agreed that measures are needed at community, national and international levels.

Question Time was part of a programme of events, leading up to the Greening Arundel Campaign launch on Saturday 20th March, organised by Arundel Agenda 21 group.
